What is the Damage Prevention Institute?

The mission of CGA's Damage Prevention Institute (DPI) is to address systemic inefficiencies in the damage prevention process through the development of a system of comprehensive participant accreditation and metrics, creating the foundation for a consolidated benchmarking and true peer review process.



What gets measured fairly and equitably, gets managed fairly and equitably.

DPI takes damage prevention to the next level:



Focuses the industry on **accountability** for all stakeholder groups



Increases **engagement** of each stakeholder group in their critical roles in the damage prevention process



Serves as an **organizational management** tool for damage prevention programs



Provides a **transparent** benchmarking process for all stakeholders



Facilitates **peer reviews** to evaluate damage prevention practices and enable greater sharing of opportunities and strategies between stakeholders

Why participate in the DPI?

The DPI will focus on balanced, unbiased measurement across stakeholder groups. In the first year of the DPI, stakeholder performance will be measured as follows:

Locators:

Accuracy and timeliness of locates

Facility Owner/Operators:

Mapping quality and timeliness of updates

Excavators

Use of safe excavation practices



How DPI Serves Locators

- Work with DPI-accredited organizations who prioritize their accountability to other stakeholders in the damage prevention process.
- Understand your organization's performance in relation to your peers.
- Drive the development of the next generation of key performance indicators in damage prevention.
- Share and learn strategies for driving down damages through peer review.

How To Become DPI Accredited

STEP 1:

Be a CGA Member.*

to all damage prevention stakeholders dedicated to reducing damages to critical underground infrastructure. Participation in the DPI is included with your CGA membership. Several membership levels are available, with lower-cost options for governments/ municipalities and organizations with fewer than 10 employees.



Complete the DPI enrollment form on the DPI website



The enrollment form requests from excavators a leadership commitment to the DPI that includes the following:

- Damage reporting
- Metrics reporting (tickets received, on-time locates, etc.)
- Whistleblower and stop-work authority
- Investigation and corrective action
- Commitment to awareness training and testing on an annual basis
- Compliance with laws and regulations
- Implementation of applicable CGA Best Practices

STEP 3:

Submit damage data to the Damage Information Reporting Tool (DIRT).

- An email invitation to create a DIRT account is sent after the DPI enrollment form is completed
- For help submitting DIRT data, access video tutorials and the user guide at cga-dirt.com

STEP 4:

Participate in a peer review.

The pilot program for peer reviews will take place in 2023, with rollout to all stakeholders in 2024.
